The Department of Revenue (referred to as “DOR” or “Department”) requested sealed bids to purchase a subscription agreement for transfer-pricing for our Corporate Tax Division in our Clinton Office located at 500 Clinton Center Drive.

DOR will contract for these services with a single vendor for a contract period beginning September 1, 2021 and ending August 31, 2024.

DOR released the Transfer Pricing Invitation for Bid (IFB) # 3160004321 on May 21, 2021. DOR received one (1) sealed bid in response to this IFB. The bid was submitted by RoyaltyStat LLC and was deemed responsive. It was the only bid received and was, therefore, ranked the highest.

The bid submitted by RoyaltyStat LLC was evaluated and deemed responsive and responsible according to the criteria stated in the solicitation.

We announce our recommendation to award a contract to the following vendor subject to approval by the Public Procurement Review Board.

However, if you prefer to have legal representation present, you must provide notification prior to the scheduled meeting so that we can also have legal representation present. Your request for debriefing must be received within three (3) business days after the issuance of this notice or no later than **June 30, 2021**. MDOR reserves the right to conduct any such debriefing via a teleconference.

Vendors are reminded that any protests of this decision must be submitted to **Erica Green, Contract Analyst, SR** within seven (7) calendar days after the issuance of this notice or no later than **July 2, 2021**. The protest must be in writing, identify the name and address of the protestor, provide appropriate identification of the procurement and resulting contract number (if known),

and detail the nature of the protest, including available supporting exhibits, evidence, or documents to substantiate any claims.

The successful vendor is instructed not to begin work, purchase materials, or enter into subcontracts relating to the project or services until execution of the contract.
