Lamar County Man Enters Guilty Plea on Two Counts of Tax Evasion

HATTIESBURG, Miss. – On August 26, 2024, 69-year-old Ray A. Sims, Jr. of Hattiesburg entered a plea of guilty on two counts of tax evasion (Mississippi Code 27-3-79) before Lamar County Circuit Judge Brad Touchstone.

Sims was sentenced to five years of probation and required to pay \$500,000 in restitution to the Mississippi Department of Revenue for sales taxes that he collected through Southeastern Concrete Company Inc., but never remitted to the state.

The charges against Sanford resulted from an investigation conducted by special agents inside the Department of Revenue's Criminal Investigation Division.

Taxpayers who abide by the law can rest assured knowing the Department of Revenue investigates and helps prepare criminal cases for prosecution of individuals who willfully defraud the state of monies that should lawfully go to toward funding our state, schools, roads, counties, cities and more.
